STATEMENT OF INTEREST

I feel that improving wildlife habitat and access to private lands is in the best interest to today's hunters. As a kid I experienced wonderful bonding moments with my father and grandfather deer hunting and fishing in the coast range and west cascades. However, in the 80,s and 90,s it became more difficult to find open areas to hunt. We finally opted to draw tags for the East Side. This changed the scope of the hunts from a day trip to a more complex camping trip.

With the decreased federal and state timber harvests the best locations to hunt deer remains with the private lands, which have various stages of forest succession. These areas also have the most significant animal damage due to the higher number of animals and limited or nonexistent public hunter access.

I have worked as a Forester for Longview Fibre Co. since 1992. When I was promoted to Assistant Tree farm manager on the 63,000 acre Silver Falls tree Farm in 1997, a hunting program already existed and was supported by the Access and Habitat program. Since that time I have worked consistently with the various hunter groups and adjacent landowners to provide access for the hunters.

The programs that I am currently responsible for include:

- Bowhunter mailing and sign up that allow bow hunters access to the tree farm.
- Meeting with the Oregon Hunter Association to organize the gatekeeper to open and close the gates daily for the rifle deer and elk season.
- Contact muzzleloader hunters to open and close the gates during the Elk season.
- Provide access for the youth hunts in Linn County.
- Mailing and invite to the successful late cow elk hunt.
- Providing maps changing and installing hunter locks on various gates and answering phone calls and hunter questions.

This is above and beyond my job description but I feel strongly that allowing access gives people the opportunity to hunt, view a working active tree farm, and gives us some much needed animal damage control.

I have a degree in Forest Management from Oregon State University. Other organizations/boards that I am involved with include:

- On the Board of Directors for the Linn Forest Protection Association.
- Member of Oregon forest Industry Council (OFIC) animal damage committee. Supporter of the OFIC collaborative research projects.
- Member of the North Cascade Animal Damage Cooperative.
- Supporter of the annual tree mortality aerial flights across the NW region.
- Alternate for the Large Timber representative on the Pudding Watershed Council.
- Participation with the annual animal damage reporting with OFIC.

- Annual reporting to the Oregon Watershed Restoration program through OFIC.
- Work in cooperation with the Forest Service, BLM, Dept of Forestry and private landowners on access, road maintenance, and improvement projects.
- Regularly attend annual landowner ODF&W biologist meetings.
- Have met with the F&W Commission to help set tag numbers for deer and elk in Marion and Linn counties.
- In regular contact with State Police on access issues and hunter patrols.
- Have participated in deer counts with the ODF&W spotlighting.
- In regular contact with local ODF&W biologists

I would consider it a privilege to serve and be a part of the Access for Habitat board.

STATEMENT OF INTEREST

I would like to be considered for appointment to the Access and Habitat Board for the Department of Fish and Wildlife as a Landowner Representative. For the last six years I have represented the Linn Forest Protective Association as chairperson of the Law Enforcement committee applying for Grants from the A&H Board to support our Timber Deputy program. The funding provided by the A&H Board has prompted more access for sportsman within Linn County.

Although not funded with A&H monies, two landowners in Linn County started a program with the Oregon Hunters Association to open 43,000 acres of private timberlands in the Wiley Creek Watershed for weekend access with check-in and check-out points. Now in its second year it is proving to be successful and popular. I worked as a landowner representative on this program.

Though the process of applying for the grants for the Deputy program I found myself interested in other projects around the state and the good they do for sportsman and wildlife. This program through the promotion incentives for landowners provides a platform for the A&H Board to be advocates for Sportsmen, and Sportswomen on private property.

Not only have I worked on private timberlands but I also own and manage small woodland in Western Oregon (90 acres) that I manage for timber and wildlife. Small Woodland owners should be represented and I could be an advocate for their concerns.

Current affiliations: Secretary-Treasure of the Linn Forest Protection Association, Associated Oregon Loggers dba Valhalla Tree Farm, South Santiam Watershed Council, Oregon Small Woodlands Association, Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation, and Oregon Hunters Association.

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Statement of Interest for Charley Moyer

1. *Experience and knowledge of hunting or knowledge and breadth of experience in the agriculture or forestry industries.*

I graduated from the University of Washington with a Bachelors of Science in Forest Resource Management in 1996. Since then I have worked for the Makah Tribe in Neah Bay, Washington, as a Forester. With the Makah I dealt with all aspects of forest management and tribal land management issues until I left for a position with Simpson Timber Company in Shelton, Washington, in 1998. With Simpson I was a GIS/Forester dealing with mapping, inventory and other forestry related projects including working on their Habitat Conservation Plan. In 2001 I was promoted to an Area Forester position in Simpson's Oregon timberlands operations. The company has since changed its name to Green Diamond Resource Company. At Green Diamond in Oregon I dealt with all aspects of silviculture, beginning with cleanup following logging, chemical spraying, planting trees, treating and burning slash, pre-commercial thinning and other related forestry related activities. In 2007 I left Green Diamond for a Forester position with Weyerhaeuser in Seaside on the North Coast Forest Area.

I learned to hunt and fish in the Washington Cascades with my father and grandfather. Since moving to Oregon and getting a resident hunting and fishing license I was able to harvest my first elk in 2002 on the company timberlands I managed. Over the years I have harvested a few more elk and caught salmon, steelhead, sturgeon and other sports fish in area rivers, bays and the Pacific Ocean.

2. *Involvement in sportsman/hunter/conservation organizations or experience with fish & wildlife resource management issues.*

Since coming to Oregon I have been working with the ODFW and ODF with elk damage issues on newly reforested timberlands. In 2001 we had a very successful emergency hunt in the Salmonberry area on our lands and ODF managed lands. With the ODF we made presentations to the Tillamook Chapter of the Oregon Hunters Association to get their understanding and cooperation with these controlled elk hunts. I have regularly attended landowner meetings with local ODFW representatives on the success of these emergency and controlled hunts and also to review additional damage areas. I have worked with the Tillamook Chapter of the Oregon Hunters Association (OHA) to provided limited access areas for "walk-in only" hunting areas for the deer and elk seasons. I have also worked with the ODFW on the Travel Management Areas that adjoin lands that I have managed. For the last four years I have coordinated the Landowner Preference tag program on Green Diamond property to help control elk damage on young tree seedlings.

3. *Leadership in sportsman/hunter/conservation organizations or involvement in agriculture or forest industry organizations.*

I have been a member of the Society of American Foresters (SAF) since 1995. I have been active in my local SAF chapters and have held leadership positions as Secretary/Treasurer at the chapter level.

4. *Leadership and experience on or with councils, boards, commission, and legislature.*

Through my work experience I have worked with the Makah tribal council on various projects dealing with budget approvals and acceptance of timber sale packages. In 2005 I worked with the ODF and ODFW to develop the field tour for the ODF&W wildlife commission's September tour and meeting in Tillamook. I have represented my company with the Animal Damage Cooperative and have been a representative on several watershed councils for various areas; Nestucca-Neskowin, Lower Nehalem and most recently Youngs River.

5. *Experience working with and/or representing the public.*

For Green Diamond I was the main contact in Oregon regarding hunting issues, therefore I have a wide experience dealing with the public on all types of hunting issues from bear hunts to beaver trapping, and deer/elk seasons. I have been able to control bear peeling on trees in the spring by sending in hunters with known experience on damage hunts to track down and eliminate the problem bears. During the deer and elk general rifle seasons I have worked to open as much of our land as possible for the general public. I think that A&H money has helped and can go further to inform landowners and hunters of the benefits of public access for hunting. The controlled hunting opportunities are a real resource to help landowners dealing with damage, but more can be done to make the connection between hunter and landowner. Tillamook is a great example of a community that supports hunting and recognizes the landowners who open their lands to hunting. The local newspapers have advertisements for hunters to buy a block of Tillamook cheese to give to the landowner as gate-openers. This is a great way for the landowner and hunter to start communicating with each other.

6. *Ability/interest in working collaboratively with others.*

I have shown my ability to work collaboratively with others on many different projects from various tree improvements cooperatives to the Swiss Needle Cast Cooperative, as well as with the Lincoln County Sheriff's Woods Deputy that is funded in part by various forestland owners. I look forward to working with the ODFW, landowners and hunting groups to help with access and habitat issues. The timberlands I work on are scattered over more than four counties and I interact with hundreds of neighboring landowners, several municipalities and

watershed councils. I couldn't even attempt to perform my job without working collaboratively with others.

7. *Participation in the A&H program.*

One of the programs that A&H money has been spent on is the Travel Management Areas in Lincoln County. The TMA has been a great success in Lincoln County and many areas that I have worked on as I have seen through feedback from the hunters and ODFW personnel. A&H money helped to provide additional support from the Oregon State Police (OSP) for game enforcement within the TMA. The OSP presence has been a great help with the hunting activities and reporting other problems that occur in the woods back to the landowners. I was in the process of developing a A&H grant request for Green Diamond, but I accepted the position with Weyerhaeuser before it could be presented to the regional A&H board.

8. *Ability to foster positive relations between landowners, hunters and ODFW.*

I think I have developed excellent relationships with the ODF, ODFW, OHA and the general hunter with the controlled cow elk hunts in my area. I have worked with the ODFW for four years on Landowner Preference tags to assist me in areas that I could not open to the general public for hunting. I think all of these tools have been a great success.

I've been hunting since I was 12 years old. I would have to say that I've been an avid outdoors person since I started college in 1995. I've hunted almost every species in OR except for Mt. Goat as I've not drawn a tag or known any one that has. I have two degrees from OSU, the first in Range Land Management and the second in Crop Science. I'm part of a small business (Bolson Seed Co. LLC) where we grow native grass seed for government agencies. I've also volunteered for NFP organization (GROWISER) where we promoted the production of native plants by collecting seed, sowing, and weed control on a 200+ acre sight. Part of the volunteer work included giving tours, continuing education for teachers, and informing the public about benefits of native plants and agriculture. I've recently purchased a 107 acre farm in Cove, OR where I raise horses and mules for personal use and hay about 30 acres. The remainder of the property is in grass and wheat production. Since I work for Boise Cascade, I'm directly connected to the forest industry and stay aware of the current forestry issues on both public and private property.
