2 **Extended Commercial Seasons**

3 In addition to the open seasons prescribed in OAR 635-003-0003 there are open seasons for Chinook salmon as
4 follows:

5 (1) Elk River Ocean Terminal Area - from ~~[October 15]~~**November 1** through ~~[the earlier of]~~November 30 ~~[or quota~~
6 ~~of 1,250 Chinook]~~ in the area described in section (1)(a) of this rule.

7 (a) The open area is all Pacific Ocean waters shoreward of a line drawn from Cape Blanco (42°50'20" N. Lat.)
8 thence SW to Black Rock (42°49'24" N. Lat. 124°35'00" W. Long.), thence SSW to Best Rock (42°47'24" N. Lat.
9 124°35'42" W. Long.), thence SE to 42°40'30" N. Lat. 124°29'00" W. Long., thence to shore (Humbug Mountain).

10 (b) During the season described in this section (1), it is *unlawful* to take Chinook salmon less than 28 inches in
11 total length; it is *unlawful* to use multipoint or barbed hooks or to fish more than four spreads per line; it is *unlawful*
12 to make more than one landing of Chinook per day; and it is *unlawful* to have in possession or to land more than
13 20 Chinook per day taken in this fishery. Landings are restricted to Port Orford.

14 ~~[(c) All vessels landing salmon caught in this season must report to ODFW within one hour of delivery or prior~~
15 ~~to transport away from the port of landing by either calling (541) 867-0300, ext. 252 or by e-mail to~~

18 (2) Tillamook Bay Ocean Terminal Area - from September 1 through ~~[the earlier of October 31]~~**September 30** ~~[or~~
19 ~~quota of 600 Chinook]~~ in the area described in section (2)(a) of this rule:

20 (a) The open area is all Pacific Ocean waters inside an area between **Twin Rocks (45°35'54" N. Lat.) and**
21 **Pyramid Rock (45°29'48" N. Lat.)** ~~[and Twin Rocks 45°35'54" N. Lat.]~~ and seaward three nautical miles offshore;

22 (b) During the season described in this section (2), it is *unlawful* to take Chinook salmon less than 28 inches in
23 total length and it is *unlawful* to use multipoint or barbed hooks or to fish more than four spreads per line; and it is
24 *unlawful* to have in possession or to land more than 25 Chinook per calendar week (Sunday through Saturday).
25 Landings are restricted to Garibaldi.

30 (3) Chetco River Ocean Terminal Area - from October 13 through the earlier of October 31 or quota of ~~[600]~~**750**
31 Chinook in the area described in section (3)(a) of this rule:

32 (a) The open area is all Pacific Ocean waters inside an area south of the north shore of Twin Rocks (42°05'36"
33 N. Lat.) to the Oregon/California border (42°00'00" N. Lat.) and seaward three nautical miles offshore;

34 (b) During the season described in this section (3) it is *unlawful* to take Chinook salmon less than 28 inches in
35 total length; it is *unlawful* to use multipoint or barbed hooks, or to fish more than four spreads per line; it is *unlawful*
36 to make more than one landing of Chinook per day; and it is *unlawful* to have in possession or to land more than
37 20 Chinook per day taken in this fishery. Landings are restricted to Brookings.

41 port of landing, location of delivery, and estimated time of delivery.

42 **(4) Coos-Coquille Ocean Terminal Area – Open for Chinook salmon harvest from September 1 through**
43 **September 30, within the area described in section (1)(a) of this rule.**

44 **(a) The open area is all Pacific Ocean waters shoreward of the 30 fathom depth contour between**
45 **43°31'00" N. Latitude line and 43°16'00" N. Latitude and within all State Waters (0-3 nautical miles from**
46 **shore) between 43°16'00" N. Latitude and Crooked Creek (43°04'50" N. Lat.).**

47 **(b) During the season described in this section (4), it is *unlawful* to take Chinook salmon less than 28**
48 **inches in total length. It is *unlawful* to use multipoint or barbed hooks or to fish more than four spreads**
49 **per line. And, it is *unlawful* to have in possession or to land more than 50 Chinook taken in this fishery**
50 **per calendar week. Landings are restricted to Charleston (Coos Bay) or Bandon.**

57 **Special South Coast Seasons**

58 In addition to the open seasons prescribed in OAR 635-013-0005 there are open seasons for Chinook salmon as
59 follows:

60 (1) Elk River Area.

61 (a) From [~~October 15~~]**November 1** through November 30 in all Pacific Ocean waters shoreward of a line
62 drawn from Cape Blanco (42°50'20" N. Lat.) thence SW to Black Rock (42°49'24" N. Lat. 124°35'00" W. Long.),
63 thence SSW to Best Rock (42°47'24" N. Lat. 124°35'42" W. Long.), thence SE to 42°40'30" N. Lat. 124°29'00"
64 W. Long., thence to shore (Humbug Mountain);

65 (b) During the season described for the Elk River Area in section (1)(a) of this rule it is *unlawful* to take
66 Chinook salmon less than 24 inches in length. **No more than one non fin-clipped Chinook salmon per day**
67 **and 10 non fin-clipped Chinook salmon in the seasonal aggregate when combined with waters of the**
68 **Sixes River and Elk River may be retained during the November 1-30 season.** It is *unlawful* to use multipoint
69 or barbed hooks.

70 (2) Chetco River Area.

71 (a) From October 1-12 in an area south of the north shore of Twin Rocks (42°05'36" N. Lat.) to the
72 Oregon/California border (42°00'00" N. Lat.) and seaward three nautical miles offshore.

73 (b) During the seasons described in section (2)(a) of this rule it is *unlawful* to take Chinook salmon less than
74 24 inches in length. No more than one Chinook salmon may be retained per day and no more than 5 fish may be
75 retained during the October 1-12 season. It is *unlawful* to use multipoint or barbed hooks.

Tillamook Terminal Area Ocean Fishery

(1) In addition to the open seasons prescribed in OAR 635-013-0004 there are open seasons for Chinook salmon in the areas described in Section (2) of this rule.

(2) The Pacific Ocean waters inside an area south of Twin Rocks (45°35'54" N. Lat.) and north of Pyramid Rock (45°29'48" N. Lat.) and seaward three nautical miles offshore are open for Chinook salmon September 1 through October 31.

(3) During the open season for ~~[adipose fin-clipped]~~coho salmon in the ocean, the Terminal Area described in section (2) of this rule is open to angling for salmon consistent with federal sport salmon management measures for the area from Cape Falcon to Humbug Mountain.

(4) During the period of **October 1 through** ~~[September 1]~~October 31, in the area described in section (2) above no more than 1 non fin-clipped Chinook salmon may be retained per day and no more than 10 non fin-clipped Chinook salmon may be retained in the seasonal aggregate when combined with all other waters in the Northwest Zone ~~[and all state waters terminal area seasons in the Marine Zone]~~with a 10 Chinook salmon seasonal aggregate limit. Seasonal aggregate applies to all non fin-clipped Chinook salmon retained between August 1 and December 31, except in the Nehalem Basin where the seasonal aggregate applies to all adult non fin-clipped Chinook salmon retained between July 1 and December 31. For purposes of this rule, adult salmon are Chinook having a length greater than 24 inches.

(5) No more than two single-point, single-shank barbless hooks are required in the ocean when these ocean waters are open for the ~~[adipose fin-clipped]~~coho salmon fishery and in the ocean outside the Terminal Area at all times.

Inclusions and Modifications

(1) The **2011 Oregon Sport Fishing Regulations** provide requirements for the Northwest Zone. However, additional regulations may be adopted in this rule division from time to time and to the extent of any inconsistency, they supersede the **2011 Oregon Sport Fishing Regulations** pamphlet.

(2) Notwithstanding all other requirements provided in the **2011 Oregon Sport Fishing Regulations** pamphlet, the following additional rules apply to adult salmon angling in waters of the Northwest Zone:

(a) All waters of the Necanicum River **Basin, Nehalem River Basin (including North Fork)**,~~[and]~~ Tillamook

134 salmon angling upstream of Peterson Creek (RM 10.2)~~[Highway 53 Bridge (RM 5.8) at Mohler]~~
135 July 1~~[September 1]~~ through December 31.

136 ~~[(B) Closed to all Chinook salmon angling above the Miami-Foley Road Bridge July 1 through~~
137 ~~December 31.]~~

138 (B) Nehalem tidewater from the jetty tips upstream to Peterson Creek (RM 10.2) on South Fork and
139 North Fork Road Bridge on the North Fork is open for non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon from
140 September 15 through the earlier of November 30 or attainment of an adult coho salmon quota of 1,200
141 non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon.

142 (C) The daily catch limit may include one adult non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon per day and
143 one non adipose fin-clipped jack coho salmon per day, and no more than 2 total adult non adipose fin-
144 clipped coho salmon in the seasonal aggregate from all waters in the Northwest Zone and Southwest
145 Zone with a 2 adult non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon seasonal aggregate limit.

146 (c) Within the Tillamook Bay Basin the following additional rules apply:

147 (A) Tillamook Bay tidewater from the jetty tips upstream to Hwy. 101 Bridge on Miami, Kilchis,
148 Wilson, and Trask rivers and Burton Bridge on Tillamook River is open for non adipose fin-clipped coho
149 salmon from September 15 through the earlier of November 30 or attainment of an adult coho salmon
150 quota of 600 non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon.

151 (B) The daily catch limit may include one adult non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon per day and
152 one non adipose fin-clipped jack coho salmon per day, and no more than 1 total adult non adipose fin-

156 (A) Mainstem Nestucca [~~tidewater and bay below Cloverdale Bridge (RM 7.1)~~]upstream of First Bridge
157 (RM 15.8) near Beaver closed to all Chinook[~~salmon and steelhead~~] angling August 1 through December 31
158 [~~September 15~~].

159 (B) Nestucca Bay tidewater (excluding Little Nestucca tidewater) from the bay mouth upstream to
160 the Cloverdale Bridge (RM 7.1) is open for non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon from September 15
161 through the earlier of November 30 or attainment of an adult coho salmon quota of 200 non adipose fin-
162 clipped coho salmon.

163 (C) The daily catch limit may include one adult non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon per day and
164 one non adipose fin-clipped jack coho salmon per day, and no more than 1 total adult non adipose fin-
165 clipped coho salmon in the seasonal aggregate from all waters in the Northwest Zone and Southwest
166 Zone with a 1 adult non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon seasonal aggregate limit.

169 (i) Nestucca bay downstream of ODFW sign at the southern end of Guardrail Hole (aka Fishery Point,
170 Brooten Road MP 4.5): Closed to all salmon/steelhead angling August 1 through December 31.

171 (C) Three Rivers closed from mouth upstream to hatchery weir deadline July 1 through September 30.

172 (D) Little Nestucca including all Little Nestucca tidewater: Closed to all Chinook salmon angling August 1
173 through December 31.

174 (E) Mainstem Nestucca River upstream of Farmer Creek (RM 12.5) closed to all Chinook salmon angling
175 August 1 through December 31.]

176 (e) In all waters of Salmon River open for Chinook salmon, the daily catch limit may include no more
177 than 1 adult non fin-clipped Chinook salmon or steelhead per day and 10 adult non fin-clipped Chinook
178 salmon or steelhead in the seasonal aggregate when combined with all other waters in the Northwest
179 Zone and all state waters terminal area seasons in the Marine Zone with a 10 adult non fin-clipped
180 Chinook salmon seasonal aggregate limit. [~~4~~]The Siletz River Basin[~~;~~] and Yaquina River Basin are open for

181 Chinook salmon, the daily catch limit may include no more than 2[~~4~~] adult non fin-clipped Chinook salmon or
182 steelhead per day and 20[~~40~~] adult non fin-clipped Chinook salmon or steelhead in the seasonal aggregate when
183 combined with all other waters in the Northwest Zone and all state waters terminal area seasons in the Marine
184 Zone with a 10 adult non fin-clipped Chinook salmon seasonal aggregate limit. Seasonal aggregate applies to all
185 adult non fin-clipped Chinook salmon retained between August 1 and December 31.

186 (A) Siletz River and Bay upstream to Old Mill Park Boat Launch at RM 36.0 open for all coho salmon from
187 September 1 through the earlier of November 30 or attainment of an adult coho salmon quota of 400 non fin-
188 clipped coho salmon.

189 (B) The catch limit may include one adult non fin-clipped coho salmon for the entire season and one non
190 fin-clipped jack coho salmon per day during periods when retention of non fin-clipped adult coho salmon is

193 (f) Within the Siletz River Basin the following additional rules apply:

194 (A) Mainstem and tributaries above Ojalla Bridge (RM 31) closed to Chinook August 1-
195 December 31; Drift Creek (Siletz River Basin) upstream of the confluence with Quarry Creek at RM 8 is closed for
196 Chinook salmon from August 1 through December 31;[-and]

197 (B) All waters of the Siletz River (including all tributaries) upstream of Old Mill Park Boat Launch at
198 RM 36.0 are closed for Chinook salmon from August 1 through December 31[-];

199 (C) Siletz River and Bay upstream to Old Mill Park Boat Launch at RM 36.0 is open for non adipose
200 fin-clipped coho salmon from September 15 through the earlier of November 30 or attainment of an adult
201 coho salmon quota of 700 non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon; and

202 (D) The daily catch limit may include one adult non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon per day and
203 one non adipose fin-clipped jack coho salmon per day, and no more than 5 total adult non adipose fin-
204 clipped coho salmon in the seasonal aggregate from all waters in the Northwest Zone and Southwest
205 Zone.

206 (g) Within the Yaquina River Basin the following additional rules apply:

207 (A) All waters of the Yaquina River upstream of the confluence of the Yaquina River and Big Elk Creek at
208 RM 18.3 and all waters of Big Elk Creek (Yaquina River Basin) are closed for Chinook salmon from August 1
209 through December 31;[-and]

210 (B) The Yaquina River and Bay upstream to the confluence of the Yaquina River and Big Elk Creek
211 are open for non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon from September 15 through the earlier of November 30
212 or attainment of an adult coho salmon quota of 575 non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon; and

213 (C) The daily catch limit may include one adult non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon per day and
214 one non adipose fin-clipped jack coho salmon per day, and no more than 5 total adult non adipose fin-
215 clipped coho salmon in the seasonal aggregate from all waters in the Northwest Zone and Southwest
216 Zone.

217 (h) Within the Alsea River Basin the following additional rules apply:

218 (A) All waters of Drift Creek (Alsea River Basin) within the Drift Creek Wilderness Area and upstream are
219 closed for Chinook salmon from August 1 through December 31;[-and]

220 (B) All waters of the Alsea River upstream of the confluence with Five Rivers at RM 21 are closed for
221 Chinook salmon from August 1 through December 31;[-and]

222 (C) All waters of Five Rivers are closed for Chinook salmon from August 1[October 16] through
223 December 31.

224 (D) The Alsea River and Bay upstream to the confluence of the Alsea River and Five Rivers are
225 open for non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon from September 15 through the earlier of November 30 or
226 attainment of an adult coho salmon quota of 675 non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon; and

227 (E) The daily catch limit may include one adult non adiopose fin-clipped coho salmon per day and
228 one non adipose fin-clipped jack coho salmon per day, and no more than 5 total adult non adipose fin-

233 Chinook salmon from August 1 through December 31;

234 (B) All waters of Lake Creek are closed for Chinook salmon August 1 through December 31 and all waters
235 of Lake Creek downstream of Fish Creek are closed to all angling from September 1 through November 30;[-]

236 (C) The Siuslaw River and Bay upstream to the confluence of the Siuslaw River and Lake Creek
237 are open for non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon from September 15 through the earlier of November 30
238 or attainment of an adult coho salmon quota of 900 non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon; and

239 (D) The daily catch limit may include one adult non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon per day and
240 one non adipose fin-clipped jack coho salmon per day, and no more than 5 total adult non adipose fin-
241 clipped coho salmon in the seasonal aggregate from all waters in the Northwest Zone and Southwest
242 Zone.

254 restrictions apply to angling in waters of the Southwest Zone:

255 (a) Within the Umpqua River Basin the following additional rules apply:

256 (A) Open for non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon in the Mainstem Umpqua River and Bay from
257 the mouth to Scottsburg Bridge at RM 27.5 from September 15 through the earlier of November 30 or
258 attainment of an adult coho quota of 1,300 non adipose fin-clipped coho. The daily catch limit may
259 include one adult non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon per day and one non adipose fin-clipped jack
260 coho, and no more than 2 total adult non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon in the seasonal aggregate from
261 all waters in the Northwest Zone and Southwest Zone with a 2 adult non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon
262 seasonal aggregate limit.

263 (b)[(a)] Within the Coos River Basin the following additional rules apply:

264 (A) All waters of the South Fork Coos River upstream from the head of tidewater at Dellwood at RM 10.0
265 are closed for all[Chinook] salmon angling from August 1 through December 31 and closed for steelhead from
266 August 1 through November 14; and

267 (B) Open for non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon upstream to the head of tide at Dellwood at
268 RM 10.0 on the South Coos River and to the East Fork/West Fork Millicoma confluence from September 15
269 through the earlier of November 30 or attainment of an adult coho quota of 1,200 non adipose fin-clipped
270 coho. The daily catch limit may include one adult non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon per day and one
271 non adipose fin-clipped jack coho salmon, and no more than 5 total adult non adipose fin-clipped coho
272 salmon in the seasonal aggregate from all waters in the Northwest Zone and Southwest Zone.

273 (c)[(b)] Within the Coquille River Basin the following additional rules apply:

274 (A) Open for non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon in Coquille River and Bay upstream to the Highway
275 42S bridge (Sturdivant Park) at RM 24.0 from September 15[4] through the earlier of November 30 or attainment
276 of an adult coho quota of 825[4,200] non adipose fin-clipped coho. The daily catch limit may include one adult
277 non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon per day and one non adipose fin-clipped jack coho salmon, and no more
278 than 5 total adult non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon in the seasonal aggregate from all waters in the Northwest
279 Zone and Southwest Zone.

280 (d)[(e)] Within the Tenmile Lakes Basin the following additional rules apply:

281 (A) Tenmile Lakes (Coos County) upstream from Hilltop Bridge are open for non adipose fin-clipped coho
282 salmon from October 1 through the earlier of December 31 or attainment of an adult coho quota of 875[500] non
283 adipose fin-clipped coho. The daily catch limit may include one adult non adipose fin-clipped coho salmon per
284 day and one non adipose fin-clipped jack coho salmon, and no more than 5 total adult non adipose fin-clipped
285 coho salmon in the seasonal aggregate from all waters in the Northwest Zone and Southwest Zone. Only one rod
286 per angler may be used while angling for coho. Streams that empty into North and South Tenmile Lakes are not

293 seasonal aggregate when combined with waters of the Elk River and Elk River Ocean Terminal Area.

301 seasonal aggregate when combined with waters of the Sixes River and Elk River Ocean Terminal Area.
