



Oregon Ocean Salmon Sport Seasons, 2024

Statewide Regulations

- Anglers fishing for salmon and all anglers fishing from boats with a salmon on board are limited to no more than 2 single point barbless hooks per line, and no more than one line per angler. Salmon may only be taken with the gear described above.
- It is unlawful to fish for or take and retain any legal species while possessing on board any species not allowed to be taken in that area at that time.
- Minimum lengths: Chinook = 22" N. of Cape Falcon, and 24" S. of Cape Falcon; coho = 16"; steelhead = 20"; and no min. length for pink, chum, or sockeye salmon in ocean fishery.
- Refer to the "2024 Oregon Sportfishing Regulations" booklet for descriptions of special marine management areas including closed areas and additional restrictions.

Leadbetter Point, WA to Cape Falcon, OR

June 22 thru **August 11, and August 19-22, and Sept. 4** earlier of Sept. 30 or 39,900 fin-clipped coho quota, with a 12,510 Chinook subarea guideline. Open seven days per week. Open for all salmon, all coho must have a healed adipose fin clip. Two salmon per day, but no more than one Chinook. **Possession of salmon onboard a vessel is prohibited in the area from August 12-18, and August 23 onward.**

Notes: Open seven days per week. Closed within the Columbia Control Zone.

Cape Falcon to Humbug Mountain

All salmon except coho season—Cape Falcon to Humbug Mt. :

March 15-October 31. Open seven days per week. Open for all salmon except coho, except for during the selective coho fishery and the non-select coho season. Two salmon per day. Beginning October 1, open only shoreward of the 40-fathom regulatory line.

Selective Coho (fin-clipped) Season - Cape Falcon to OR/CA border:

Open for All Salmon. 45,000 fin-clipped coho quota. Open seven days per week. All salmon, two salmon per day. All retained coho must have a healed adipose fin-clip.

Cape Falcon to Humbug Mountain –June 15 through earlier or August 18 or quota.

Humbug Mountain to OR/CA border - June 15 through earlier of August 4 or quota.

Non-mark-selective Coho Season (all salmon) - Cape Falcon to Humbug Mt.:

Open September 1 through the earlier of September **15** 30 or **30,700** 25,000 non-mark-selective coho quota. Open days may be modified in-season. Open seven days per week. All salmon, two salmon per day.

Notes:

- Within the Stonewall Bank Yelloweye Rockfish Conservation Area salmon angling is restricted to trolling on all depth halibut days.
- Chinook Season (all salmon except coho) will reopen March 15, 2025 unless modified by in-season action in March 2025.

Humbug Mountain to OR/CA Border

All salmon except coho season—Humbug Mt. to OR/CA border :

May16-August 31 Open seven days per week. Open for all salmon except coho, except for during the selective coho fishery. Two salmon per day.

Selective Coho (fin-clipped) Season - Cape Falcon to OR/CA border

Open for All Salmon. June 15 through earlier of August 4 or 45,000 fin-clipped coho quota. Open seven days per week. All salmon, two salmon per day. All retained coho must have a healed adipose fin-clip.

Note: Any salmon caught within the Humbug Mt. to OR/CA border area must be landed within the State of Oregon.
