Ocean Recreational Season between Leadbetter Pt., WA and Cape Falcon, OR

Seasons: Open June 25 through the earlier of Sept. 30 or 84,000 marked Coho quota (Chinook guideline of 7,700).

Two salmon per day, but no more than one Chinook, and all Coho must have a healed adipose fin clip. **Beginning**

12:01 AM Saturday, July 16: The area between Leadbetter Pt., WA and 46° 15' N latitude and shoreward of 124° 08' 40" W longitude is closed to all recreational salmon angling.

Effective 12:01 AM Saturday, July 16: The area between Leadbetter Pt., WA and 46° 15' N latitude and shoreward of 124° 08' 40" W longitude is closed to all recreational salmon angling. Angling in the remainder of the Columbia River Ocean Salmon Management area remains open for 2 salmon per day, but no more than 1 Chinook salmon and all retained coho salmon must be marked with a healed adipose fin clip.
