Purpose

- Update Division 008 Rules and remove redundant language in 065 Rules
 - Update rules on current wildlife areas and public access points
 - Revise Parking Permit language



Amendments to Division 008

Major Points of Clarification of Rules

- Consolidate and general housekeeping of rules found in other regulations
- Consistent language among Wildlife Area rules
- Prohibit dogs from running at large at fishing areas
- Revise Parking Permit Rule language



Amendments to Division 008

➤ Wildlife Areas Newly Added to Div. 008:

- Gods Valley WA (Clatsop Co.) – Listed in Div 065, Big Game & Game Bird Regulations
- Little Sheep WA (Wallowa Co.)
- Lostine WA (Wallowa Co.)
- Minam WA (Wallowa Co.)
- Wallowa WA (Wallowa Co.)

➤ Wildlife Areas Deleted:

- Sumpter WA – Agreement ended 1994. Returned to Baker County ~ 1998
- Willamette Greenway WA – Covered by OPRD Rules



Amendments to Division 008

➤ **Fishing Access Areas Included Under Div. 008:**

- Knight Park/Salmon River Access (Lincoln Co.) – Overnight Parking
- Lorens Drift Public Access (Tillamook Co.) - Vandalism



Amendments to Division 008

➤ **Late additions:**

- 0050 (5) - Makes it legal to pick berries and fruits w/o permit
- 0115 (7) – Daily hunting permit and checkout required
- 0120 (12) – Prohibit gas powered boats at Ladd Marsh WA
- 0147 (14) Sturgeon Lk Refuge and boats
(15) Closed to hunting except certain species
- 0190 (4) – Discharging firearm only while hunting during seasons at EE Wilson WA (does not include trap range)

Parking Permit Issue



Amendments to Division 008

➤ Parking Permit Rule Revisions 008-0151

From:

- (1) Parking is permitted only in designated parking areas. A parking permit is required at all times for all fee parking areas.

To:

- (1) For any ODFW Wildlife Area where a parking permit is required, a valid parking permit must be displayed in the vehicle while parked in any designated parking area or while parked at any location, including along federal, state or county road right-of-ways, when any occupant of the vehicle enters the wildlife area.
