DIVISION 051  
GENERAL GAME BIRD REGULATIONS

635-051-0000

Purpose

(1) The purpose of these rules is to establish dates, areas and other restrictions for hunting game birds pursuant to ORS Chapter 496.

(2) The document entitled "~~2013-2014~~ 2014 - 2015 Oregon Game Bird Regulations," is incorporated by reference into these rules.

Other Restrictions

Except as provided in section (1)(a), (b), (c), (2) -(6) of this rule, it is unlawful: To hunt within the corporate limits of any city or town, public park or cemetery, or on any campus or grounds of a public school, college, or university or from a public road, road right-of-way, or railroad right-of-way.

(1) Migratory game bird hunting is permitted within the city limits of Warrenton in the following described areas:

(a) ~~Beginning at a point located at the west end of the Lewis and Clark Bridge (Alternate Highway 101) at the southern boundary of the Warrenton city limits and west bank of the Lewis and~~

1 Clark River, then westerly along the common southern boundary of the Port of Astoria airport and the  
2 Warrenton City  
3 limits to the west bank of Adams Slough (formerly Adair's Slough), then northerly along the west tracks,  
4 then westerly along said railroad tracks to its intersection with Northeast King Avenue, then northerly  
5 along Northeast King Avenue to the mouth of the Skipanon River, then generally northwesterly following  
6 a contour line 100 yards inland from the shoreline at mean high water of the Columbia River, and on the  
7 Columbia River side of the Burlington Northern Railroad tracks to its intersection with the  
8 Warrenton/Hammond city limits at Tansy Point, then in a generally southeasterly direction upstream  
9 along the Columbia River, Youngs Bay and Lewis and Clark River to the point of beginning. **Beginning**  
10 **at the north abutment of the west landing of the Lewis and Clark River Bridge (Alt HWY 101),**  
11 **NW ¼ Section 25, Township 8 Range 10 N, and continue along the city limits at the south edge of**  
12 **the Astoria Regional Airport, southward and westward along Alt HWY 101 following the city limits**  
13 **to the intersection of SE Airport Ln, then northward and westward following the city limits to their**  
14 **intersection with Adams Slough at a point approximately 375 feet north of Airport Lane (SE 12th**  
15 **Pl). Continue in a northerly meander along the western edge of Adams Slough to the Youngs River**  
16 **dike along the north edge of the airport. Left along the dike to Holbrook Slough and south along**  
17 **the eastern edge of Holbrook Slough to the abandoned railroad right of way. Westward along the**  
18 **abandoned railroad right of way to NE King Ave. North along NE King Ave continuing northward**  
19 **until its extension would intersect with the Skipanon Channel. Cross the Skipanon Channel and**  
20 **run northward along the water's edge to the tip of the peninsula north of the lumber mill, then**  
21 **follow west and south along a line approximately 300 feet from the edge of high water to a tide gate**  
22 **on the dike north of the Warrenton Wastewater Treatment Plant. From here, continue**  
23 **northwesterly and northerly below the river side of the dike extending to Tansy point, then**  
24 **northwesterly through that part of the industrial facility north of Tansy Point to the river side of**  
25 **the highest bank and continuing northwest on the river side of a line defined by the extension of the**  
26 **Warrenton Riverside Trail culminating at the northwestern corner of the BioProducts plant**  
27 **property. From here, the waterborne boundary theoretically extends outward into the river**  
28 **approximately 2,200 feet to a point where it conforms with the city limits east and south to the point**  
29 **of beginning at the Lewis and Clark River Bridge.**

30 (b) Beginning at a point of intersection with the low tide of the Pacific Ocean and the westerly  
31 extension of Delaura Beach Road (County Road #34), then easterly along Delaura Beach Road  
32 and Oceanview Cemetery Road (County Road #321) to the junction with Wild Ace Lake Drive to the  
33 Warrenton School Dump Road (County Road #286), then easterly along the Warrenton School Dump  
34 Road to the junction of Southwest Juniper Avenue, then northerly along Southwest Juniper Avenue to the  
35 road's end, then continuing northerly along the common boundary of Section 16 and 17 to the  
36 Warrenton/Hammond city limits, then westerly along the Warrenton/Hammond city limits to the low tide

1 of the Pacific Ocean, then southerly to the point of beginning. **Beginning at a point in the SE ¼ Section**  
2 **20, Township 8 Range approximately 80 feet south of the cul de sac of SE Kalmia Ave along the**  
3 **abandoned Wild Ace Lake Road in a southerly meander to the northern end of the southern**  
4 **extension of SE Juniper Ave. Then westerly 500 feet along the south property line of tax lot**  
5 **810290000200 to the intersection of Delaura Beach Lane and Ridge Road. Continue north along**  
6 **the eastern edge of Ridge Rd 2,600 feet to the northern property line of said tax lot, thence**  
7 **eastward to the point of beginning south of the Kalmia Ave cul de sac.**

8 (c) Beginning at a point of intersection with the most southerly boundary of the Warrenton city  
9 limits and Oregon Coast Highway 101 and the west bank of the Skipanon River, then northerly along the  
10 west bank of the Skipanon River to the bridge on (Crab Pot Way) Alternate Highway 101 (Fort Stevens  
11 Highway #104), then in a generally easterly direction along Alternate Highway 101 to Southeast 14th  
12 Place, then in a generally southeasterly direction along Southeast 14th Place and its easterly extension,  
13 crossing the Oregon Coast Highway 101 to its intersection with the Warrenton city limits, then southerly  
14 and westerly along the line of the Warrenton city limits to the point of beginning. **Beginning at the**  
15 **intersection of Alt HWY 101 (HWY 104 Spur) and SE Dolphin Ave., (NW ¼ Section 28, Township 8**  
16 **Range 10N )continue south to Highway 101. Southeasterly along Highway 101 to the Skipanon**  
17 **River, and then in a northerly meander along the west bank of the Skipanon to the bridge at Alt**  
18 **HWY 101 (HWY 104 Spur) then east 650 feet to the point of beginning.**

19 (2) Game bird hunting is permitted within the city limits of Dunes City.

20 (3) Game bird hunting is permitted within the boundary limits of the Klamath Falls Airport.

21 (4) Waterfowl hunting is permitted in the following portion of Miami Cove lying within the city  
22 limits of Garibaldi: That land in the east one-half of the northwest quarter of Section 22, Township 1  
23 North, Range 10 West, Willamette Meridian, lying south of Coast Highway 101, and in the east one-half  
24 of the southwest quarter of Section 22, Township 1 North, Range 10 West, lying north and west of Coast  
25 Highway 101, provided that no hunting be permitted within 100 yards of any residence or commercial  
26 structure.

27 (5) Waterfowl hunting is allowed within a portion of Coos Bay City limits as described in Coos  
28 Bay City Ordinance number 100, section 3(2)(a) as of August 3, 2007.

29 (6) Waterfowl hunting is allowed within Boardman City limits as described in City of Boardman  
30 Resolution 4-2011 as of January 19, 2011.

31 (7) No person shall take any game bird or destroy the eggs or nests of any game bird without a  
32 permit issued by the department.

33 (8) Notwithstanding the prohibition in paragraph (7):

34 (a) If registered through the Resident Canada Goose Nest and Egg Registration Site of the U.S.  
35 Fish and Wildlife Service (<https://epermits.fws.gov/eRCGR/geSI.aspx>), any person may destroy the eggs  
36 or nests of resident Canada geese:

1 (A) Inside incorporated cities or urban growth boundaries; or

2 (B) On golf courses, parks or other highly developed recreational areas outside incorporated cities  
3 or urban growth boundaries.

4 (b) The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, or anyone issued a depredation permit by the USFWS,  
5 may take any migratory game bird, its eggs or nest for the purpose of protecting public health or safety, to  
6 address public nuisance or to deal with crop depredation. Any migratory game bird captured for the  
7 purpose of translocation must be reported to the department and the translocation site approved by the  
8 department prior to release.
