Understand how to foster a climate in which employees strive to meet the highest standards of performance



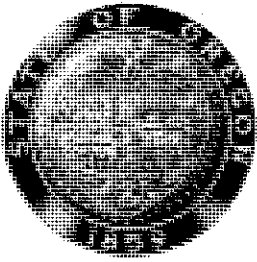
