Need for the Rule(s):

These amendments are needed in order to consolidate and streamline rules for the three art contests into one division.

Documents Relied Upon, and where they are available:

Draft rules are available from the division's rules coordinator located at Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, 4034 Fairview Industrial Drive SE, Salem, OR 97303.

Fiscal and Economic Impact:

The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife has three art contests (Habitat Conservation Stamp, Upland Game Bird Stamp and Waterfowl Stamp.) Currently, rules for these art contests are in three separate divisions. These amendments are needed in order to consolidate and streamline rules for the three art contests into one division.

The rules are believed to be fully compatible with legislative direction on the goals of wildlife management in Oregon.

Statement of Cost of Compliance:

1. Impact on state agencies, units of local government and the public (ORS 183.335(2)(b)(E)):

Proposed rules will affect state agencies, units of local government, and the public, respectively, as discussed below:

- A. The only state agency that will be affected by adoption of these rules is the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW). The proposed rule changes will streamline art contest rules, so that using them will be more convenient for staff. No significant additional costs or revenues for ODFW are expected with these rule changes.
- B. No units of local government are expected to be affected by these rules. No significant changes from the current levels of any local agencies' operations or expenditures are expected as a result of the adoption of these rules.
- C. The public will not be affected by these rules.

2. Cost of compliance effect on small business (ORS 183.336):

a. Estimate the number of small business and types of businesses and industries with small businesses subject to the rule:

None affected.

b. Projected reporting, recordkeeping and other administrative activities required for compliance, including costs of professional services:

None expected.
