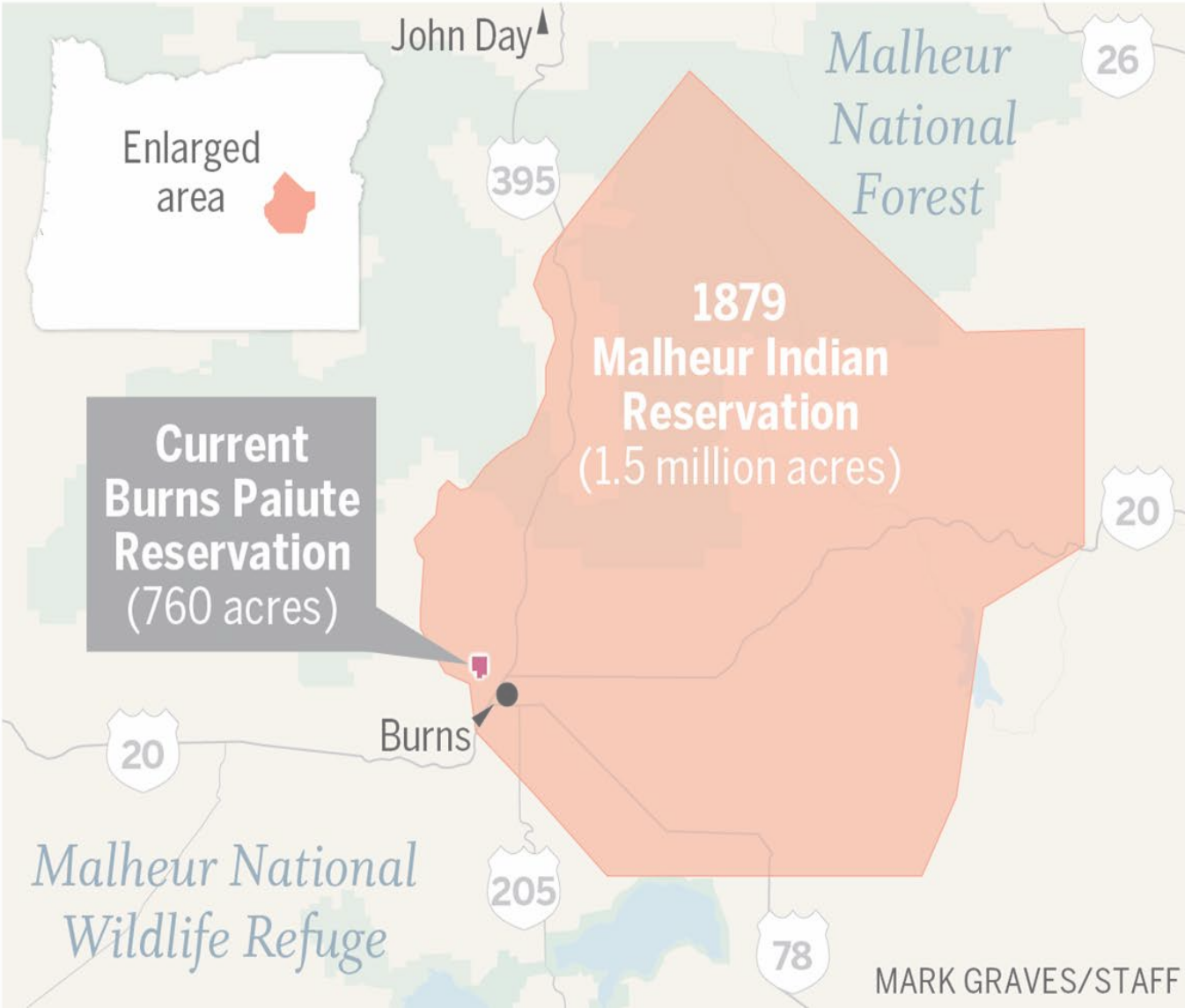

The Malheur Indian Reservation once covered nearly 1.5 million acres of land in Harney, Grant and Malheur counties. Today, the Burns Paiute Tribe's reservation consists of just 760 acres on the outskirts of Burns.

Ceremonial and Cultural Use Hunting Tags

Key Features

- Ceremonial tags are specific for 8 deer, 6 elk and 4 pronghorn
- Season dates are January 1 through three days prior to state seasons
- Hunt Area includes federal public lands and Tribal lands in portions of two Wildlife Management units
- Tribal members will carry tribal identification and tribally-authorized hunting tag
- Use of wildlife for commercial purposes is prohibited
