

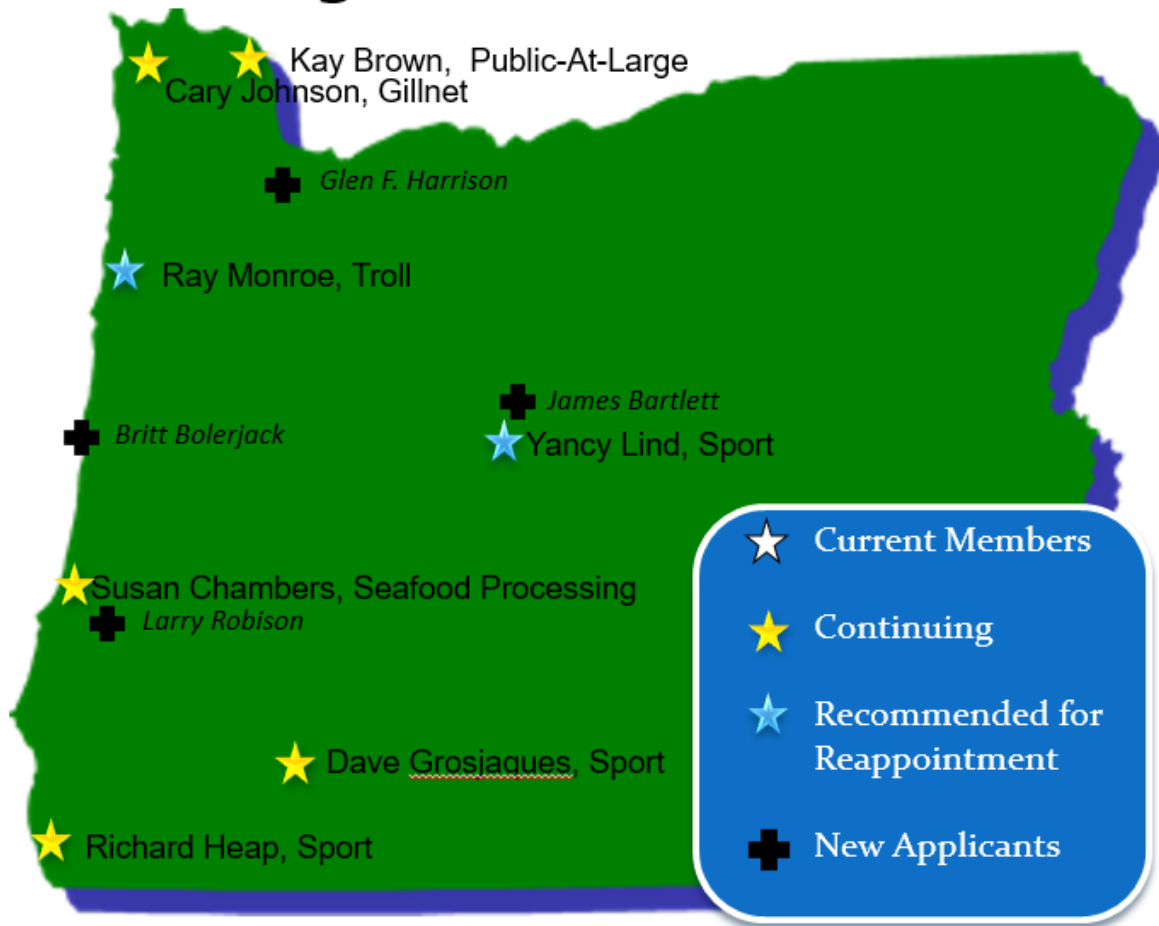

As a native Oregonian, I grew up exploring the riffles, runs, pools, and tides that Oregon has to offer. These explorations have continued throughout my adult life and have lead me to a career of fisheries research and management. It would be an honor to serve on the Fish Restoration and Enhancement Board.

My career in fisheries started with Portland General Electric (PGE) in 2000. I was originally hired as a fisheries technician responsible for hydro project relicensing and juvenile and adult fish passage. With the new license issued to the Pelton Round Butte Project in June of 2005, I began working as a fish passage biologist for PGEs Pelton Round Butte Project focusing on the reintroduction of spring Chinook, summer steelhead, and sockeye salmon into the upper Deschutes, Crooked, and Metolius Rivers. I have spent most of my time working with state and federal agencies, consultants, contractors, and engineers designing, implementing, and maintaining juvenile and adult fish passage facilities located at the Pelton Round Butte Project.

I believe I bring a common sense approach to problem solving and I follow a set of values, which have helped me succeed in whatever I do. I believe I can make a significant contribution to the Fish Restoration and Enhancement Board and thank you for your consideration.

I feel highly qualified for a position on the Fish Restoration and Enhancement Board and believe I would be of value to the board. I have worked for Portland General Electric (PGE) West-side and East-side hydro for 19 years as a hydro fish passage biologist and currently work for PGE as an environmental specialist, project manager.

My responsibilities include but are not limited to directing the work of technical and support personnel, managing multiple fish passage construction and implementation projects for PGE's hydro facilities. I also plan, schedule, prioritize, document, and share information, maintain company compliance with ESA fisheries issues, relicensing, and personnel management.

My regulatory knowledge and experience consists of formulating and presenting policy recommendations, and using analytical skills to evaluate the potential effects of proposed projects. I am responsible for planning, coordinating, and conducting technical investigations and advanced environmental analysis on hydro project facility design and implementation.

My experience and skills in developing or revising policies and codes to comply with Federal or State regulations include monitoring programs and other studies. Other activities include coordination of data gathering efforts and consultation with the National Marine Fisheries Services and the Federal Energy Regulating services, prepare documents as needed for consultation, track issues and communicate issues and progress with other biologists and agency personnel, in addition, to developing cost effective ideas and methods to deal with facility development and safety.

My experience in overseeing consultants and associated contract include, ensuring the operation and maintenance of hydro project fish facilities, license compliance, and support relicensing of the west and east side hydro facilities. I also Assist with work agreements with cooperating agencies, edit and coordinate publication of annual accomplishment reports, and maintain good public relations.

I believe that of all the programs that ODF&W is responsible that the R&E program is the best managed. I have had the opportunity in the last 45 years to work with ODF&W on a number of projects, and those projects partnered with the R&E program have been the best received. As I will soon be retiring, I feel that this will afford me an opportunity to continue to share my knowledge and experience: from being both a provider of 45 years and as an aged 65 user. This experience should provide valuable expertise in both, what a project will take to complete and how it will be perceived by the user. It would be my pleasure to be able to continue working with the R&E program as a board member instead of an applicant.

My work experience consists of 45 years of working for the Coos County Parks Department, the last 20 as Parks Director. Our parks are located on all the rivers and lakes of the county. We, along with assistance of the OSMB, and ODF&W provide most of the access points for fishing, and boating opportunities on these waterways. Over the years I have been involved in the construction, maintenance, and operation of our facilities whether it be large campgrounds, day use areas, boat ramps, or primitive parks only open for fishing. I have had the opportunity to serve on the Oregon Parks Association Board and work with other county parks departments in providing our users with the best recreational opportunities throughout the state.

My community involvement currently is as a member of the Tenmile Bass Club which I have been for over ten years. I am currently serving as the treasurer and have also served as President, and Vice president. Each year the first weekend of August we host the Tenmile Open with up to 75 boats and this year will be our 38th. The club normally has 11 tournaments a year scattered along the coast and Willamette Valley. \$2000.00 of the proceeds earned from the Open, are used to provide 3-\$500 scholarships to graduating high school students towards Fish & Wildlife degrees. An additional \$500 scholarship is given to support the OSU Bass club.

My fishing experience, according to my folks, started when I was 6 months old on the Sixes River and I've had a pole in my hand ever since. I have had the opportunity to fish several of our rivers which include: the Owyhee, Blitzen, Umpqua, Sixes, Elk, Roque, Coos and of course all the forks of the Coquille. I have been on a number of others but have not had the chance to wet a line. I have fished all the lakes in the Willamette Valley, most of the lakes in southern Oregon and of course all the lakes along the coast from Florence south.

I feel my experience from being both a provider and the user would serve well on the Restoration and Enhancement Board.

Currently the main issue I see facing sport fisheries is the lack of the resource. The reduction in the salmon and steelhead population has had a definite impact on both the fishermen and management. In my opinion the focus on trying to maintain a native population has taken the focus off what is important to the users, which is catching fish. The loss of hatchery programs has eliminated the opportunity to have a thriving population of catchable fish.

Through my job I have had the privilege to speak with a lot of Old-timers who have said that the rivers of this state will support larger numbers of fish than are currently here so why not start putting some back. Years ago, ODF&W discontinued to stock most rivers with rainbow trout sighting the impact they have on the native cutthroat population thereby eliminating another opportunity to catch fish. Instead we now must go to a lake, which in most instances requires a boat.

Another opportunity I see ODF&W is missing is marketing the warm water fishery we have here in the state. Oregon has some of the best warm water fisheries in the western United States, yet they are seen as an invasive species needing to be eradicated. It's a little late for that now so let's take advantage of it. I have seven grandchildren, aged two to sixteen and they all like to fish. I hope they will be able to do that even when they get to 65 like grandpa! Once again, the more opportunities we can give folks to go fishing and take their kids the better it is no matter what the species they are fishing for.

I have been involved with stream enhancement projects in the Pacific Northwest for over two decades. During my 23 years with the Tillamook County Soil and Water Conservation District I have worked on riparian, fish passage, livestock exclusionary fencing, tree shrub establishment, and nutrient management projects that have contributed to the health and survival of downstream salmonid migration. I am a good listener and can work with a team.
