Dear Chair Wahl and Commissioners

It has come to my attention, as the lead author of the Petition to Initiate Rulemaking an Amend OAR 635-050-0070, that there are portions in the document that suggested we thought we were submitting a petition for a decision on our proposal to close 32 million acres of federally-managed public lands to commercial and recreational beaver trapping/hunting. As this was not our intent, I went back and checked the document. Yes, section III. Introduction and section VII. Conclusions do indeed create confusion as to expectation.

Our intent was, and is, to request that the Commission initiate rulemaking and the public process. The two sections noted above are holdovers from the April draft petition we were crafting when we were thinking of bringing a petition before the Commission for the June 12, 2020 meeting. At that time, it made sense to stress the value of a decision on beaver trapping/hunting prior to November 15 when the trapping/hunting season begins, and to stress the benefits that Oregon would gain if the Commission voted yes on our proposal. When we decided to do a request instead of a petition, we set the draft aside. When our request was denied a vote due to advice from the Department of Justice because of questions related to the Rule Summary language noticed to the public, I picked up the April draft petition again. Post June meeting my focus was on the points made by ODFW staff that needed attention. While we were clear in our own mind that we were now at the "Petition to Initiate Rulemaking" stage, those sections were not appropriately adjusted to reflect that understanding. My apologies for the confusion.

I see that the ODFW press release correctly states what the Commission is reviewing. We would greatly appreciate it if the ODFW website would also be corrected to reflect the actual nature of our Petition to minimize confusion with the public.

Re: Petition for Rulemaking on Beaver Trapping and Hunting

Chair Wahl and Members of the Commission:

Humane Voters Oregon advocates for humane treatment of animals in Oregon. We participate in policymaking proceedings before administrative agencies, the state legislature, and local governments. In addition, we participate in Oregon's electoral process. We have board members from a variety of animal welfare organizations but are not affiliated with any other state or national organization.

Hunters and trappers kill about 1,500 beavers in Oregon every year (on average over the last five years). Several individuals and groups have now submitted a rulemaking petition asking the Commission to close all federal public lands in Oregon to further hunting and trapping of beavers. We are not among the petitioners, but we support the requested rulemaking because it is likely to lead to:

- More humane treatment of beavers.
- More and better habitat for other wildlife and fish.
- Economic benefits that exceed costs.
- Simplified closure rules.

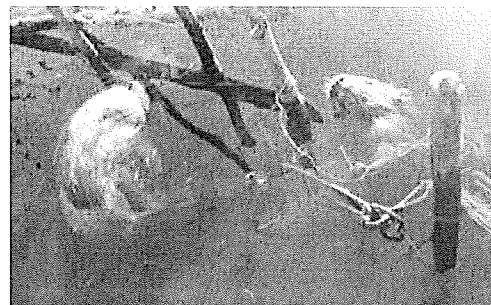
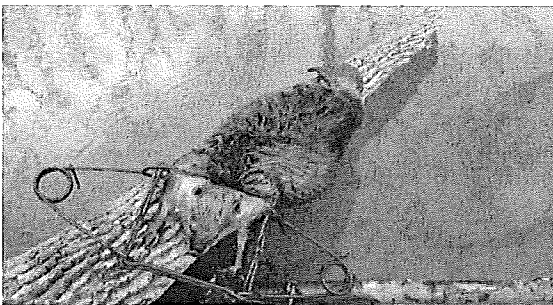
We also discuss whether there are better options for achieving the proposed rule's substantive goals with less economic impact (we do not believe so).

A. The rulemaking would lead to more humane treatment of beavers.

Current rules allow beavers to be trapped and hunted throughout the state – with a license and in season on public lands – except in several specifically closed areas. Trapping apparently is more common than hunting. Common methods for trapping include “bodygrip” and “foothold traps.” (U.S. Dept. of Agriculture, *Wildlife Damage Management Technical Series, Beavers* (March 2017) (“USDA Technical Memo”), pp. 5-8.) A bodygrip trap “exerts tremendous pressure and impact when tripped” and is meant to kill the beaver instantly. (USDA Technical Memo, p. 6.) However, “[t]rap testing in semi-natural environmental conditions has shown that, with some killing traps and snares, animals would not have lost consciousness within the [Agreement on International Humane Trapping Standards] time limits and could have stayed alive for long periods of time if the researchers had not anesthetized them. Work on traplines also showed that killing traps and snares were not always performing as expected, and ≥30% of animals captured in legal traps in Canada and the USA were struck in non-lethal regions and lost consciousness many minutes past the acceptable time limit, or were still alive for hours after capture.” (G. Proulx (Alpha Wildlife Research & Management Ltd., Sherwood Park, Alberta) and D. Rodtka (Retired Problem Wildlife Specialist, Alberta Agriculture), *Killing Traps and Snares in North America: The Need for Stricter Checking Time Periods*, Animals (Basel) (August 2019) (<https://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/pmc/articles/PMC6719131/>).

Foothold traps apparently work as implied and, for beavers, should be used with “a submersion set attachment with a weight.” (USDA Technical Memo, p. 8.) “When a beaver trips a foothold trap, it will immediately head for the water. The submersion set with a weight will hold the trapped beaver underwater until it drowns.” *Id.*

Here are photographs from the internet – one from a site promoting trapping and one from a site opposing it – of beavers killed by traps:



We recognize that trapping is legal and accepted by many in Oregon. Still, it seems to us a cruel way to kill an animal, and something that should not be done without a good reason. People sometimes trap and kill beavers because they are damaging property. However, trapping on federal public lands is likely to be primarily just for recreation and, to some extent, for fur that sells for roughly \$10-\$15 per beaver. (Oregon Furbearer Regulation Proposals (agency staff report), June 12, 2020 (“June 2020 Staff Report”), p. 7.) Those reasons do not seem to us to justify the harm inflicted on beavers through trapping. Thus, we support elimination of trapping on federal public lands.

The Department's June staff report suggests beavers self-regulate their population. (June 2020 Staff Report, p. 8.) Thus, trapping apparently is not necessary to prevent overpopulation.

Many commenters before the Commission, including hunting, fishing and trapping groups, praise the North American Model of Wildlife Conservation.¹ According to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the model says wildlife should “only be killed for a legitimate purpose”; and that “[m]arkets for game are eliminated.” (<https://www.fws.gov/hunting/north-american-model-of-wildlife-conservation.html>.) Killing purely for recreation and fur seems inconsistent with these principles, especially if done in a way that causes prolonged pain and suffering.²

B. The rulemaking would lead to more habitat for other animals.

Assuming the proposed rulemaking would result in more beavers and more beaver dams (addressed below), there appears to be no dispute that it would result in many benefits for fish, other wildlife, and watershed health in general.

1. Beaver dams provide many benefits.

According to the Department's publication, *Living With Wildlife: American Beaver* (p. 5):

- “Beaver dams create ponds that provide fish protection from strong winter flows. They increase the storage of water resulting in a more stable water supply and maintenance of higher flows downstream for a longer period of time.
- By providing plenty of woody debris in which juvenile fish can hide from predators, beaver dams help young trout and salmon survive their first vulnerable year. They also provide winter pool habitat that is important for fish such as cutthroat trout and coho.
- Beaver ponds help store leaf litter in the water and in turn support aquatic insect production, an important food for fish, amphibians, waterfowl, bats and songbirds.
- Beaver dams contribute to improved nesting and brood rearing areas for waterfowl in ponds and surrounding areas. The increased growth of vegetation provides additional forage and cover for a variety of wildlife such as big game and songbirds.
- Beaver ponds attract and provide habitat for mink, river otter, muskrats, turtles, frogs and salamanders.
- The trees that die as a result of rising water levels behind beaver dams attract insects that are a food source for many wildlife species such as woodpeckers. The tree snags also provide homes for cavity-nesting birds.

¹ The staff's June PowerPoint presentation to the Commission on the furbearer regulations (“June 2020 Presentation”) said (p. 6) that the regulations were required to be consistent with the North American Model.

² The description by the Service adds: “[a] market for furbearers continues as a highly regulated activity, often to manage invasive wildlife.” However, to the extent the carveout can be read to apply to trapping beavers, a native species, for a \$10-\$15 pelt, it is inconsistent with the overriding core principles.

- Beaver dams create wetlands which help control downstream flooding by storing and slowly releasing water, reducing the severity of high stream flows particularly after winter storms and spring snow melt.
- Beaver created wetlands improve water quality by removing or transforming excess nutrients, trapping silt, binding and removing toxic chemicals and filtering out sediment.
- Beaver dams facilitate ground water recharge and help raise the ground water table. This promotes vegetative growth, which in turn helps stabilize stream banks and minimize erosion. In some areas, beaver dams have been a major factor in building up soil in meadows and reducing the impact of invasive vegetation.
- Beaver dams reduce water velocity, reducing channel scouring and streambank erosion.
- Wetlands created by beavers attract a variety of fish and wildlife that provides recreational and aesthetic values to landowners.”

2. Closing federal lands to beaver hunting and trapping would result in more beavers and more beaver dams.

The Department opposes the petition primarily on grounds that, in the Department’s view, there is not enough evidence that hunting and trapping of beavers on federal public land is: (a) suppressing beaver populations below habitat carrying capacity; or (b) reducing the number of beaver dams. On the second point, the Department notes that not all beavers build dam.

In fact, there is at least some evidence that closing an area to beaver hunting and trapping will result in more beaver dams. In their 1997 request to the Department to continue the trapping moratorium in the Ochoco National Forest, for example, Forest Service officials said the moratorium, then in effect for 10 years, had resulted in “increases in the number of pools, sediment retention, number of neotropical bird species and amount of amphibian habitat – especially for spotted frogs, tree frogs and longtoed salamanders [and that] [r]earing habitat for redband trout has increased dramatically also.” In addition, petitioners have demonstrated that there is, in fact, additional habitat that could be occupied by beavers as is, or possibly with some restoration assistance from people. (Petition, pp. 21-25.)

Meanwhile, the Department does not have compelling evidence that beaver hunting and trapping *will not* result in more beavers and therefore more beaver dams. The Department relies on stable “harvest” numbers (relative to number of licensed hunters and trappers) and rough estimates suggesting hunters and trappers are killing only a small percentage of the total beavers each year. However, the Department acknowledges that “[n]o contemporary nor science-based statewide population estimate exists.” (June 2020 Presentation, p. 32.) Instead, it estimates the beaver population for one area as an example (Tillamook County, which has the highest average annual “harvest”) based on stream miles and expected densities per mile and compares that (1,221) to the average annual reported “harvest” in Tillamook County (154) to conclude that hunters and trappers kill only about 13% of the county’s beavers every year while 30% is a percentage that “beaver populations can sustain.” (June 2020 Presentation, pp. 32-26, 42; June 2020 Staff Report, p. 8.)

This analysis is rough at best, and there is likely a difference between the level of hunting and trapping that beaver populations “can sustain” and the level that results in the most beaver dams. Hunters and trappers are killing about 1,529 beavers every year (on average over the last five years). (June 2020 Presentation, p. 36.) Even accepting that not all beavers build dams, it seems reasonable to assume, absent evidence to the contrary, that the killing has some suppressive effect on the number of beavers and therefore the number of beaver dams. Moreover, other actions by the Department seem to acknowledge that reducing or eliminating hunting and trapping will lead to more beaver dams. As the Department notes, for example, it has agreed to close several areas to hunting and trapping, presumably based on a belief that their presence creates positive effects for watersheds. Also for example, “the Department began a voluntary program in 1997 to discourage the trapping of beaver in critical coho habitat in Oregon coastal streams.” (June 2020 Staff Report, p. 9.) Presumably that is because the Department recognized that the benefits beavers provide for coho salmon would increase if beaver hunting and trapping were reduced.

C. The rulemaking would create economic benefits that exceed the costs.

Assuming the rulemaking leads to more beaver dams on federal public lands – which we believe to be true, as discussed above – it would generate substantial economic benefits in the form of “ecosystem services” and costs avoided for restoration work, much of which is driven by legal obligations to recover threatened and endangered species. (Petition, pp. 39-41.) The benefits are difficult to quantify, but almost certainly in the millions of dollars. (*Id.*)

The maximum financial cost would be a potential reduction in revenue to fewer than 200 people. (The average number of beaver trappers in Oregon is about 150, June 2020 Staff Report, p. 10.) Maximum revenue from beaver trapping – assuming average annual “harvest” of 1,529 (June 2020 Staff Report, p. 10), a high pelt price of \$15 (*Id.* at 21), and that the pelt of every killed beaver is sold – is about \$23,000. The actual financial cost would be significantly lower because: (1) not all beavers killed by hunters and trappers come from federal public lands; (2) not all pelts are sold; and (3) hunters and trappers may be able to make up the revenue in other places.

Moreover, this is just an estimated reduction in *revenue*. The economic value of an activity should be measured by its profit (because society does not benefit from an activity for which the costs exceed the benefits), which in this case is probably less than zero (after considering costs for equipment, travel, etc.). (See June 2020 Presentation, p. 13 – “Average expenditures (\$1,897*) far exceed any profit” for furbearer hunting and trapping generally.)³

Thus, an economic benefit-cost analysis favors the petition – so much so that it should be accepted even if there are uncertainties about whether the requested rulemaking would result in more beavers and more beaver dams.

³ Policy makers typically mean financial when they say “economic,” which is the assumption here. True “economic” analysis includes all costs and benefits, whether reflected in financial transactions or not. Beaver hunters and trappers – recall there are about 150 of them – likely engage in their unprofitable activities because they get intangible satisfaction. But their intangible satisfaction needs to be weighed against the intangible satisfaction of all the people who want ecosystems restored, wildlife kept alive, etc.

D. The rulemaking would create a simple, consistent closure rule.

Several areas of federal public land in Oregon already is closed to beaver hunting and trapping. Several additional closures are requested. The results could be confusing to hunters and trappers in terms of knowing which areas are open to hunting and trapping and which are not. A single, consistent rule for federal public lands would be simpler and easier to follow and would also likely increase compliance with closure rules.

E. There are not better options for achieving the substantive goals.

The Commission agenda on the Department's website asks commenters to address whether there are better options for achieving the proposed rule's substantive goals with less economic impact. In our view there are not. Smaller, more limited closures would create confusion about which areas are open and which are not and would fail to achieve the substantive goal of increasing the number of beavers, and beaver dams, across broad geographic areas in need of habitat restoration. The proposed rule is already limited to avoid limitations on private property rights. Finally, the suggested concern for adverse economic impact is misplaced. As discussed above, revenue from beaver hunting and trapping on federal land is less than \$20,000 per year, and profits are likely less than zero.

RE: Letter in support of beaver trapping ban in National Forest

ODFW Commission Members,

During the last Commission meeting regarding beaver trapping ban on Federal forest lands ODFW presenters claimed there were no studies that showed benefits to fisheries. That statement was untrue. I also believe that ODFW's statement about tunneling beavers is also a misconception of why this happens in nature.

Bank dwelling beavers bank tunnel to change the environment caused by channeling river and stream basins. Anyone familiar with these tunnels has stepped in a few of their holes. Beavers are engineers of their environment. Beavers likely used the tunneling to offset natural landslides they would have to deal with in the past. Their genetics have preprogrammed this self-sustaining engineering of rivers and streams. They tunnel like hard rock miners encouraging erosion to modify channeling. These bank dwellers are generational engineers working to improve their environment for future generations. We should learn from their persistence of common good for future generations.

There is more happening with beaver ponding colonies than we can see with our eyes. As ponds form in areas where trees have been cut, all that is left are stumps that have become flooded by the ponded waters. If given enough time the root systems of these stumps rot away and the ponded water connects to the sub-waters in the alluvial soils (sand & rock.) These subsurface waters are cooled, filtered and return downstream as springs and seeps. This action reduces water temperature and enhances the streambed environments. Over and over this process happens. Trees drill into the ground and the beavers cut them down connecting warmer surface water with cold ground waters. Remember the rule how water seeks the same level as it enters. Without beavers intervention our silted in stream banks act as a cap trapping the water from entering and exiting the alluvial soils and this is one of the reasons we have warmer river temperatures. Without active beaver colonies the cooling cycle is broken with diminished water storage.

There is now supporting science that show beavers have a positive effect in areas of large fires. The wetlands they create recover quicker and help support wildlife. The fire breaks these animals create is needed especially during drought conditions. Beaver colonies trap large amounts of sediments and help improve spawning habitat.

Besides storing and cooling waters beaver dams may provide a physical barrier to spawning fish during low water years. Though well intentioned biologist open these blocked areas, they may be doing more harm than good. I believe it is more likely nature is holding the fish back for a reason. The blocked fish are forced to spawn in areas with sufficient water instead of upriver where there may not survive or successfully reproduce.

Healthy beaver colonies require beneficial habitat and this will need to be addressed. With limited monies available I believe we could accomplish this by using the correctional system for labor to grow plants, planting, watering and installing needed managing devices like beaver deceivers.

Dear Commissioners:

The Wildlife Society is an international organization founded in 1937, representing nearly 10,000 professionals, including scientists, managers, educators, technicians, planners, consultants, conservation officers, students and others who manage, conserve, and study wildlife populations and habitat. In Oregon, the Oregon Chapter of The Wildlife Society (ORTWS) represents nearly 800 such professionals from many areas of public and private enterprise. Our mission is to promote wise conservation and management of wildlife resources in Oregon by serving and representing natural resource professionals. A central purpose of ORTWS is to support scientifically sound management policies.

ORTWS is writing in response to the most recent petition submitted on September 10th, 2020 to the Commission to amend OAR 635-050-0070 as it pertains to where American beaver (*Castor canadensis*) may be trapped within the state, specifically:

- Requests to permanently ban beaver trapping across all federal lands in Oregon

Update and Summary Statement:

ORTWS previously submitted comments to the Commission on May 25th, 2020 related to a very similar petition that was discussed at length during the June 2020 Commission meeting. In response to the most recent petition we have updated our letter to include a summary of our current recommendations below.

Summary

The Oregon Chapter of the Wildlife Society does not support a *permanent* beaver trapping ban on all federal lands in Oregon. Instead, we are a proponent of using thorough, well-researched, and locally relevant science to guide the management of the state's wildlife resources. By creating a permanent ban, the State decreases the opportunity to use tools, such as trapping, in occurrences when that action may be of ecosystem benefit. For example, as seen in published research from Massachusetts, beaver trapping bans can have unintended consequences, such as increasing human-wildlife conflict, that change public attitudes (Jonker et al. 2006, 2009; Seimer et al. 2013). Developing management strategies must balance both the biological necessity of conserving this important species on the landscape, maintaining public support,

and engaging a variety of stakeholders in effective, science-based management to fulfill the public trust. A moratorium may be warranted, but such an event should only occur after addressing substantial, existing gaps in our knowledge to make such decisions. For instance, biologists lack current baseline population estimates, even rough densities between regions within our state, as Derek Broman with ODFW, mentioned during the June Commission meeting. The Oregon Chapter of TWS suggests further evaluation of harvest and habitat related management of beavers. We encourage the Commission, and ODFW, to invest more time and resources to 1) support much more robust, long-term monitoring regimes, and 2) identify appropriate changes based on accrued data and its analysis.

During the June Commission meeting, we observed a broad spectrum of both opinions and science-based information on beaver trapping and management. This discussion resulted in a decision from the Commission that more time and information was needed to understand the best approach before moving forward with changes to existing management strategies. The Commission sanctioned the creation of a beaver working group tasked to work collaboratively together to identify long-term solutions for managing beaver populations within Oregon. We feel bringing a diverse set of stakeholders to evaluate collaborative and creative solutions will be a positive step. Oregon TWS encourages the Commission to continue to support their original decision to convene such a working group and to provide clear direction – perhaps to identify research priorities and weigh alterations to harvest dates, quotas, and/or trapping closures.

Conservation biologists strive to identify conservation priorities through long-term population monitoring, and these efforts are fundamental to wildlife management as a discipline. While ideal, long term trend data or historical distribution records are often limited. Significant data gaps may exist for various taxa across time and space, due to the limited and often declining funding available to state fish and wildlife agencies. This reality of modern wildlife management should be taken into consideration in this, and similar issues – however arguing for no action based on a lack of information is an indefensible long-term strategy.

In closing, we encourage a formal arrangement to join stakeholders, agency staff, and researchers to promptly assess beaver populations and identify science-based management solutions. Oregon TWS members are willing and interested in being a part of such a working group.

Detailed Comments:

The best available science does not support permanent trapping bans

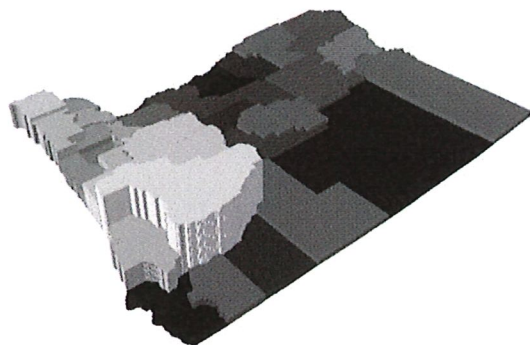
Figure 1: Beaver trapping and hunting take in Oregon from 1997-2016. Notice the total take has declined significantly since 1997 in response to reduced trapping and hunting efforts. Harvest success per unit of effort has remained steady, this is one indication that populations are stable and trapping/hunting pressure is not negatively affecting population (ODFW, 2018).

ORTWS does not recommend the adoption of this request based on our review of the best available science on current beaver populations and management strategies within the state of Oregon. A permanent ban on beaver trapping across all federal lands in the state lacks data to support claims that recreational and commercial beaver trapping are limiting factors to beaver populations (Figures 1 & 2, Appendix). Annual harvest of beavers has decreased since 1950 as

a result of reduced hunting and trapping efforts, and current beaver populations in Oregon are considered to be healthy (Hiller, 2011). Through our review of available research, we determined there is a need for more data collection and additional studies on habitat availability and habitat use by beaver throughout the state to better inform management decisions. When resources such as water and food are limited, beaver move to areas where those resources exist.

Numerous scientific articles showcase the benefits beaver play as ecosystem engineers and as a keystone species across the west (Naiman et al. 1986, Pollock et al. 1995, Gibson and Olden 2014, Bouwes et al. 2016). Their value to the ecological health of riparian systems and their ability to improve habitat for other species cannot be understated. However, management decisions that limit sustainable use of wildlife resources must be evaluated based on biological science and demonstrate effective strategies to accomplish ecological restoration goals.

A recent beaver relocation study conducted in the Alsea Basin, which included release sites on Siuslaw National Forest, did not identify recreational or commercial trapping as a cause specific source of mortality (Petro et al. 2015). Another research study conducted in western Oregon found no evidence that beaver dispersal is limited by terrain features and that beaver appear to move freely within watersheds (manuscript in review, J. Taylor personal communication). Ongoing research in western Oregon is developing models to look at the effects of beaver dams on water temperature, developing models to predict beaver occurrence, and integrating beaver habitat use with climate change scenarios. More studies like these need to be completed to better understand best practices for managing watersheds that include beaver.

Sustainable wildlife resource management and responsibility

Permanent trapping bans would be in opposition to the well-established practices of sustainable resource harvest and proven wildlife management strategies widely utilized in the North American Model of Wildlife Conservation (Organ et al. 2012). The long-term success of the North American Model comes from seven interdependent principles that must be maintained for consistent, sustainable conservation. A core principle of the North American Model is the application of wildlife science to discharge management of wildlife resources. Given the lack of data on negative impacts of trapping, combined with harvest data showing recreational trapping harvest rates per unit effort have been consistent, there is little indication that trapping is having a negative population impact (ODFW, private communication, May 13, 2020). Trapping has long been recognized as an appropriate management tool for wildlife and habitats ([AFWA](#) 2015), and significant efforts have been put forward to implement and maintain appropriate management techniques and strategies. Statewide or even regional bans on recognized management tools must be supported biologically, be limited in scope both spatially and temporally, and allow for the resumption of sustainable use when appropriate.

The Wildlife Society has adopted internationally accepted principles of natural resources conservation. These principles stipulate that management must maintain essential ecological processes, preserve genetic diversity, and ensure sustainable population numbers for the continued persistence of the species and the ecosystems they affect. Regulated trapping in Oregon is consistent with all of the aforementioned criteria and is recognized as an ecologically

sound method of harvesting and managing furbearers that also provides for recreational and economic benefits ([TWS 2020](#)). Additionally, we support the Best Management Practices (BMP) for trapping that have been developed by the Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies ([AFWA 2020](#)) and encourage ODFW to continue to promote these BMPs in furbearer management and outreach programs. Finally, regulated trapping is an important component of the lifestyles and tradition of many people, and was the primary economic and political driver behind the U.S. establishing the Oregon Territory back in the early 1800s. Maintaining interest and support in sustainable activities that rely on the conservation and long-term survival of the species and associated habitats is good policy, using a robust foundation of wildlife science. Support for beaver populations must include all stakeholders, including those likely to be impacted by beaver behavior. Maintaining sustainable trapping activity is an established management method that allows the address of beaver conflict, while continuing to maintain funding for beaver conservation, and support for beaver populations as a whole.

Data and research is necessary to better inform management decisions

Current data on beaver harvest indicate a sustainable population, however there are gaps in what land managers want from beaver and what beaver can provide. A review of beaver-related restoration practices in the western US indicated the need for investment in research, as implementation of restoration practices is occurring without evidence of efficacy or established best management practices (Pilliod et al. 2017). ORTWS strongly recommends that the Commission support further research related to managing watersheds that include beaver. All stream or river restoration projects should have baseline information on seasonal and annual use by beaver prior to initiating a project, and follow those observations through and after project completion. Monitoring of restoration efforts that include beaver are critical to address habitat restoration goals, and associated benefits to salmonids and other species. As wildlife managers, and public servants it is critical to address the efficacy of these efforts, to fulfill the public trust responsibility.

We reviewed numerous existing beaver trap bans in Oregon that date back decades, including Mt. Hood, Wallowa-Whitman, Ochoco, Malheur, and Umatilla National Forests. Despite an average length of ~46 years for trapping limitations, we found no peer-reviewed research or written evidence in general that changes in beaver populations, or their effects on the landscape, were monitored much less reported. To ban beaver trapping in Oregon without baseline information on beaver and a plan for monitoring those effects is ill-advised and against the practices of responsible wildlife management.

Recognizing the complex public acceptance and understanding of trapping

ORTWS recognizes that significant opposition to trapping exists among the public and we strongly advocate for further research to be conducted on furbearers, trappers, trapping methods, and attitudes of the public toward trapping to advance understanding and facilitate resolution of this controversial issue. Healthy beaver populations improve habitat for a variety of species and have large ecosystem benefits. However, beavers also have a history of conflict with human populations, with the potential for damage and associated loss of support from local communities. As seen in published research from Massachusetts, beaver trapping bans can

have unintended consequences, such as increasing human-wildlife conflict, that change public attitudes (Jonker et al. 2006, 2009; Seimer et al. 2013). Developing management strategies must balance both the biological necessity of conserving this important species on the landscape, maintaining public support, and engaging a variety of stakeholders in effective, science based management to fulfill the public trust.

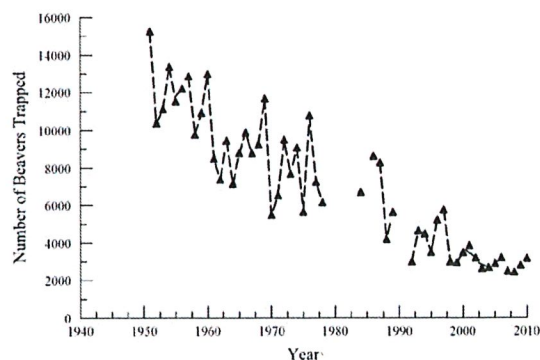

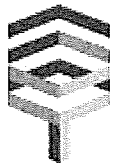

Chair Wahl, Director Melcher and members of the Commission,

My name is Kyle Williams and I am the Director of Forest Protection for the Oregon Forest & industries Council. Together with the Oregon Small Woodlands Association, we would like to thank you for the opportunity to provide comments on the petition to change the Oregon Furbearer regulations.

The Oregon Forest & Industries Council (OFIC) is a trade association representing more than 50 Oregon forestland owners and forest products manufacturers. We protect and manage more than 5 million acres of Oregon forestlands, employ nearly 60,000 Oregonians, and together make Oregon the nation's largest state producer of softwood and plywood.

The Oregon Small Woodlands Association represents non-industrial forestland owners who own between 10 and 5,000 acres of forestland. Our more than 1,500 members are from local chapters in all parts of the state.

OFIC and OSWA promote the forest industry's leading role in delivering environmental and economic benefits while balancing the sustainable use of forest resources. As stewards of these lands whose health and sustainability is critical to our way of life, we rely on the latest science and technology to continuously guide us in improving the environmental, social and economic value of healthy working forests.

Collectively, our forestry community strongly opposes the petitioned request to amend OAR 635-050-0070 as they pertain to where beavers may be trapped within the state. It is our shared belief that the acceptance of that petition and the proposed amendments represent a perilous course of action that begins to erode the standard agency driven public process for rulemaking. Further, the petition was founded on a lack of sufficient scientific evidence to support both the claims of harm from trapping and the effectiveness of the amendments in addressing the suppositional population threat.

We have said before, the best place for sound science-based management of Oregon's wildlife, both game and non-game species lies within recommendations of the staff at ODFW. The process of repeatedly petitioning the Commission for piecemeal actions via rulemaking will undoubtedly lead to a counterproductive, misguided, and unwieldy relationship with stakeholders. This exact topic is already a walking embodiment of that outcome. Four months ago this very commission embarked on a collaborative workgroup solution to this question, only to have an attempted hijacking of the process before it even began. The simple fact is, some of the players don't like the inevitable outcome of transparent public process with informed stakeholders at the table.

The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife has long held to high standards of policy making based on strong science. Unfortunately, in this instance, the petitioned request to ban beaver trapping lacks demonstrable evidence to prove the need or alignment with the mission of the Agency. In places where



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similar bans already exist there is no data to show increases in population or damming behavior tied to the trapping bans. To our knowledge, there is no reliable research linking pressure from, or effectiveness of trapping, to limitations on beaver population.

While we appreciate some of the intended outcomes, we strongly caution against anecdotal species management, specifically in this example the assertion that banning trapping will equate to more beavers, who will create more dams, leading to an increase in Coho. Not to lose sight of the fact there is again, no demonstrable science to prove this concept, what we do know is that beaver thrive in early seral riparian conditions. Most, if not all modern forestry regulations and management plans are intended to create exactly the opposite of those conditions in near stream areas. It is very likely that the reason forested watersheds lack historical damming frequency is because habitat conditions have changed. The only thing a trapping ban will accomplish is the further erosion of opportunity to use and enjoy Oregon's wildlife by present and future generations.

Further, the data that the trapping community provides through their mandatory reporting is well established and invaluable in the management of other species. The broad brush of banning beaver trapping across "all federally managed public lands and the waters that flow through them" would not only miss the mark for conservation of the species, but may inadvertently remove a valuable tool for information collection.

If there were an urgent need for protections for beaver or any other species in Oregon, I am confident that the Agency staff would bring those concerns forward to the Commission. I am also confident that those conditions do not exist for beaver in Oregon, and once again reiterate our strident opposition to the petitioned requests to amend OAR 635-050-0070. Either allow the workgroup process to play out, or trust the staff to bring recommended changes in 2022 when the regulations are again up for adoption.

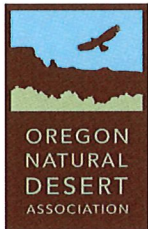
