



AGENDA ITEM SUMMARY

BACKGROUND

The Oregon Conservation and Recreation Fund (OCRF) was created within the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (department) as a way for Oregonians to support a broad range of conservation and recreation efforts throughout the state. The intent of the OCRF is to increase the department's capacity to protect and enhance the species and habitats identified in the Oregon Conservation Strategy and create new opportunities for wildlife watching, urban conservation, community science, and other wildlife-associated recreation.

Expenditures from the OCRF are recommended to the Commission by the Oregon Conservation and Recreation Fund Advisory Committee (Advisory Committee). Since the formation of the OCRF, 116 projects have been funded through five rounds of competitive requests for proposals (RFP). These projects occur throughout all of Oregon's ecoregions and have provided needed funds to ODFW partners promoting outdoor equity and access as well as science-based conservation and research. The Advisory Committee seeks to make multiple, diverse expenditures in each funding round encompassing diverse geography, taxonomy, representation of program priorities, and partner engagement.

In 2022, the OCRF received \$5 million of General Fund as part of a statewide drought relief package (HB 5202), with \$4 million for use on drought, wildfire, and aquatic habitat resilience related work and \$1 million to be used for broader OCRF mission-related work. The Advisory Committee released the sixth request for proposals (RFP) to the public in January 2023, which closed in March 2023 with 73 applications (see Commission Attachment 3 'Submitted Projects Overview_Winter 2023'). Each project proposal was scored by at least two Advisory Committee members as well as reviewed by content experts from ODFW staff and the Oregon Office of Outdoor Recreation using established criteria as defined in Commission Attachment 4 'Project Scoring Criteria'.

The Advisory Committee met on June 5th, 2023, to discuss project reviews and select projects based on overall rankings (per the defined review process in the OCRF Expenditure Framework) and the desired diversity of project types and geographies. The Advisory Committee recommended 25 projects for funding for a total expenditure of \$985,502.85 from the OCRF. Many of these projects have a clear connection with statewide needs around drought and wildfire research, monitoring, and outreach while addressing several of ODFW's identified needs for fish, wildlife, and their habitats.

The Advisory Committee is seeking the Commission's approval for the expenditure of \$985,502.85 from the OCRF to fund 25 projects selected from the Winter 2023 OCRF RFP cycle (see Commission Attachment 2 'Projects Selected for Funding').

PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT

All Conservation and Recreation Advisory Committee meetings are open to public participation and have time on the agenda for comments from participating members of the public. The opportunity to apply for funds was well publicized through a press release, multiple emails, and amplification through our partners' communication networks.
