# General recap slide of the regions proposals

- X Proposals Submitted
- \$X million Requested
- X of Critical and High Priority proposals
- Anything else you think is important for overview slide



- Create 1 slide/proposal submitted MAX.
- Briefly present only medium to critical priority projects on the main slides. Include all remaining low and non-funding-ready projects on the final slide for reference, but without formal presentation. Be prepared to answer questions about any project during discussion.
- Assume a total presentation time of ~30 min–45 min
  - Do not exceed 45 min for your presentation – let me know if this is an issue
  - I would recommend you try to spend the same amount of time on each proposal
  - The Committee is curious and on-the-ground practitioners, so I recommend you become somewhat familiar and create a high level cheat sheet for all the proposals for any questions you may get asked.
    - **You can of course bring this cheat sheet and any other notes with you into your presentation!**
- Slides may recap more than 1 proposal at a time.
  - You may choose to lump proposals onto slides by project type. (implementation, planning, research, etc) or by priority of the proposal assigned (Critical, High, Medium, Low, not ready for funding).
  - Whatever flows best for your presentation style



- Recommended Touch points – Part 1

- Proposal Highlights:

- Showcase the innovative and impactful nature of the proposals. Briefly summarize each proposal, emphasizing its unique contribution to the region's needs and challenges - **or its lack there of**
- Focus on clear outcomes and deliverables. Explain how each proposal intends to achieve its goals and make a tangible difference in the community.
- Demonstrate community engagement and partnerships. Highlight any collaborations with local organizations, stakeholders, or beneficiaries within the proposals.

- Impact and Sustainability:

- Emphasize the long-term benefits of the proposals. Go beyond immediate outcomes and showcase how the project will create lasting positive change in the region – **for those that will create change, no need to falsely uplift poor proposals.**
- If possible, Explain how the project will be sustained beyond the initial grant funding, whether through additional fundraising, community involvement, or other means.
- Discuss any potential impact of each proposal on the region's economic, social, or environmental well-being
- **Discuss its benefits to the HCP covered species, or lack there of**

- Visualize your presentation effectively. Use maps, charts, and images to showcase regional data, project locations, and impact areas as you see fit – ***make this your presentation.***
- Share success stories. If past grant-funded projects have achieved significant results in the region, showcasing them can inspire confidence and support for the new proposals.
- Be passionate and enthusiastic! Your own conviction in the value of the proposals will be contagious and encourage further engagement from the audience.
- Remember, tailor your presentation to each specific region and its unique context. By effectively communicating the strengths and potential impact of the grant proposals, you can generate excitement, support, and potential ODFW partnerships for their success.
